A Balanced budget was agreed on 20 February, with more money for social care, SEND and highways.

There is a ten per cent real terms increase for children's services aimed at helping children stay at home where possible and in Oxfordshire when they need residential support and to support improvements in special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

There is also extra money for highways, especially gulley maintenance.

Funding for new SEND school in Didcot:

Projected to open in 2026/7, it is intended that the school will have capacity to teach 120 children with SEN related to autism and/or social, emotional, and mental health. £14.4 million is to be invested.

Fix My Street improvements:

The number of categories has been streamlined but with more sub-categories to make it easier to find the right section. The changes are aimed at reducing the number of reports sent to the wrong department or council, which can delay the problem being resolved. Feedback survey

Mobility Hubs:

Oxfordshire County Council has a budget of £1.5m over three years to develop 'mobility hubs' across the county. These could be major sites or as simple as bike racks by a bus shelter or a car club. The county is assessing where sites could benefit from this initiative (mobilityhubs@oxfordshire.gov.uk)

Planned capital highway maintenance map:

A <u>map</u> of planned highway maintenance (e.g. surface inlay, surface dressing) shows future road maintenance projects. Proposed (draft) schemes for 2024-2025 can be viewed by pressing the blue button with three lines and selecting the year 2024-2025.

Household Waste and Recycling:

OCC will no longer charge for small amounts of DIY waste (requires booking, up to 5 chargeable items or 1 plasterboard piece). The change will cost £0.5 a year. A new recycling service for vapes has also been introduced at all Oxfordshire HWRCs.
