Purpose of the Report

To provide an update on the support Thame Town Council provided for Lord Williams's ACE Week.

Update – Year 7's

- 1. Town Councillors and Officers welcomed the year 7 students, who became Councillors for the day giving them the opportunity to experience local democracy first hand. They debated, had to decide on local issues and vote on making future improvements and changes to the town centre.
- 2. Each Tutor group considered the seven proposals, choosing two proposals to present to their peers and Councillors. As a group they then voted on the project they MOST want to see implemented in Thame.
- 3. The topics discussed over the week and voted first as a group were:-
